The Programs by Brenda Lewis

The Book of Mormon Foundation is looking forward to providing a variety of programs which will meet the needs of those who are seeking greater understanding into the truths offered within the pages of the Book of Mormon. Following is a list of the programs which are currently being offered or will be offered in the very near future:

Book of Mormon Internship Program - This program is designed to enhance the spiritual growth and development of each intern, and to prepare them to become spiritual leaders in their homes, congregations and communities. Each one has the opportunity to gain knowledge and understanding from a variety of individuals who have insights on a particular topic. Beyond gaining knowledge, each has an opportunity to testify to others, become service focused, develop leadership skills, and build confidence in speaking before groups of people. Ten students have been selected for the Summer 2000 Book of Mormon Internship Program.

Spanish Classes - Individuals who greatly desire to witness to the heritage people of the Book of Mormon may desire to learn Spanish in these classes along with other missionary-minded individuals.

Classes at The Book of Mormon Foundation building - The Book of Mormon Foundation will be providing a variety of classes for adults ranging from spiritual insights, to archaeology, to enhancing their knowledge and understanding of The Book of Mormon. Regular Book of Mormon story times are being planned for children.

Congregational Book of Mormon Days - Many rich gems from the Book of Mormon are shared with congregations through the sharing of testimonies, dramas, teaching presentations, and more. Children's activities may be included.

Children's Book of Mormon Days - This is a fun-filled, informative day in which the beauty of The Book of Mormon is introduced to children through the use of drama, games, activities, storytelling, and more.

Give It To The World Program - Missionary Book of Mormons are provided free of charge for witnessing to individuals or groups about the Book of Mormon.

The Pledge Program

As you know, there are many voices in the work of the Lord requesting financial support. We are one of those voices. We are trusting that the need for the continuation of the unique ministry offered at The Book of Mormon Foundation (formerly Foundation for Research on Ancient America) will inspire you to consider the following proposal in order to insure that it will progress over the long term.

Current Situation: For many reasons, our financial support has steadily decreased over the past few years. This seems to be true for many other church organizations that also rely upon your generosity. This trend has caused us to reduce expenses significantly by cutting costs on *The Witness* magazine and administrative functions. The existing programs have enough funding to progress forward for this year. At this point, the critical need is to occupy and maintain the building at 210 West White Oak, Independence, MO. It is a focal point for worship services, meetings, classes, library resources and fellowship.

One source of income that previously helped us meet the mortgage shortfall was the rental income from a tenant leasing part of the building. The tenant has now moved to a new location. This reduction in monthly income creates a tremendous financial challenge for us to continue as a viable ministry to the Restoration.

Proposal: We feel that the mortgage payment on the building is our most significant expense. The current balance is about \$45,000. It will be extremely beneficial for the Foundation if we can retire the mortgage debt. Our desire is to gather enough pledges/contributions from the Book of Mormon believers

to pay it off and allow future contributions to be spent on programs rather than facilities. This would allow us to enhance and expand the programs that are already providing positive results to the saints, especially among the youth.

How can you help? Printed below is a pledge/contribution form to allow you to make a pledge/contribution to specifically pay off the mortgage. I know that each of you reside in a different financial position, but we all know that many hands make light work. For example, if we could get 450 Book of Mormon believers to give \$100, then we would meet our goal. Some can give much more and some can give less. Each one is equally important in the total.
